Beginning of the Academic Year

The academic year commenced on **3rd April 2024** for classes I to XII. Students were warmly welcomed back by the principal during the general assembly, setting the tone for a year filled with learning and aspirations.

Academic Excellence

“Achievement is largely the product of steadily raising one’s level of aspirations and expectations.” This year, our students continued to make us proud with outstanding results in the CBSE Board Examinations:

- **Class X Results:** 82 students appeared, achieving a 100% pass rate. The school topper, Miss **Divya Das**, scored an impressive **97.40%**.
- **Class XII Results:** 27 students appeared, with Master **Manish Kumar** emerging as the school topper, scoring **88.20%**.

To support academic excellence, **extra morning classes** are conducted for classes X–XII, and **remedial classes** are regularly organized for classes VI–IX to help students achieve their full potential.

Teacher-Workshops and Training

As lifelong learners, our faculty underwent continuous professional development. Each teacher completed a **50-hour learning programme**, enhancing their skills and pedagogical strategies.

Parent and Student Engagement

Several seminars and workshops were conducted to engage parents and students meaningfully:

- Awareness session on the **POCSO Act, 2012** was conducted for both parents and students.
- A **Career counselling** and **online psychometric assessment** was done for classes IX–XII.
- An **Orientation programme** was organised for parents and students of classes X and XII, focusing on CBSE Board Examination preparation.

Best Class Award

To promote effective classroom management, attendance, discipline, and cleanliness, the **Best Class Award** was presented monthly.

Technological Advancements

- **Robotic Classes and STEM Lab:** These sessions encouraged innovation and problem-solving skills, preparing students for 21st-century challenges.

The **Cabinet Election** reflected the spirit of democracy, and elected members took their oaths during the **Investiture Ceremony** to lead their peers responsibly.

Social Outreach Programme

- As part of **Sanrakashan - The Conservation Drive**, the school inaugurated "**Wings and Roots**", a Vegetable and Butterfly Garden, symbolizing growth and sustainability and to motivate the students to be nature friendly.
- The School bagged **Third Prize in Inter-ABG Schools, Coding Competition**. Master Prince Prasad of class XII and Master Anmol Gupta of class IX, were the participants.
- The school earned **second prize in the Inter ABG-Schools Literary Fest “Rhetoric”- Character Carnival Competition**, reflecting our students' creativity and passion for theatrical activity.
- The school proudly bagged **2nd runner-up in the Inter-School Spelling Bee Competition (Primary Level)**, held at Appa Public School, Gulbarga.
