Annual Report 2024–25

It is with immense pride and satisfaction that I present the Annual Report of The Aditya Birla Public School, Reddipalayam, for the academic year 2024–25. This year has been a journey of academic rigor, holistic development, and steady growth, reflecting the collaborative efforts of our students, staff, parents, and management.

The following report encapsulates the achievements, initiatives, and progress made across academics, co-curricular, infrastructure, safety, and community engagement over the past academic year.

Academic Excellence

The school successfully completed 232 planned working days with full dedication from both staff and students. Academic planning and timely execution ensured the smooth conduct of classes, assessments, and revision schedules.

Examinations included unit tests, mid-term, half-yearly, and final examinations. Class X students appeared for the CBSE Board Examination in March 2025.

To support academic achievement, Mentor-Mentee groups were created for Class X, where each teacher closely mentored five students. Remedial classes were also conducted: 12 hours per week for Class X and one remedial period per subject each week for Classes I–IX.

Mentorship and counselling programs helped weak learners improve gradually in both academics and confidence. Classroom observations, lesson monitoring, and teacher diaries were also checked regularly for accountability.

Introduction of Aditya Experiential Curriculum

- Introduced in Oct–Dec 2024 for LKG & UKG.
- Focused on hands-on, activity-based learning to strengthen foundational years.
- Parent orientation sessions conducted to familiarize guardians with the curriculum's philosophy and methodology.

Faculty and Professional Development

The school maintained a teaching strength of 19 teachers, achieving an effective teacher-pupil ratio of 1:26.5. Our dedicated faculty are the backbone of the institution, ensuring holistic education to every child.

Capacity-building programs were attended by teachers, covering competency-based lesson planning, experiential learning, digital transformation in classrooms, safety and well-being of children, and mental health awareness.

Teachers also participated in Minds Matter training, CBSE Capacity Building Programs, and ABEA workshops. The Principal attended leadership workshops at Gyanodaya, Mumbai, focusing on redefining school leadership in the modern context.

Student Development & Guidance

Regular counselling sessions were arranged for students on topics such as emotional balance, stress-free exam preparation, personal hygiene, wellness, and mindfulness practices. A strong emphasis was placed on mental health and student happiness.

Parents were invited to orientation and awareness programs. Sessions were conducted for board exam preparation, parenting strategies for weak learners, and Aditya Experiential Curriculum for early childhood education.

Special individual counselling sessions were also conducted with the school counsellor and principal, and a register was maintained for monitoring progress.

Co-curricular and Cultural Activities

The school offered a vibrant mix of cultural, literary, and creative programs throughout the year. Competitions such as poem recitation, elocution, storytelling, origami, debate, art, music, and group drama allowed students to showcase their talents.

Annual events included Kidzania (for LKG–II), Vatayan (Annual Day for Classes III–VII), and Anveshnam (Science & Art Expo for Classes III–IX).

Special observances were celebrated with enthusiasm, including Republic Day, Independence Day, International Yoga Day, World Environment Day, Children’s Day, Founders Day, Alumni Day, and National Integration Day. These events instilled values of patriotism, environmental awareness, and social responsibility.

Sports and Achievements

Sports remained a vital component of our curriculum. Students actively participated in chess, archery, karate, equestrian sports, and athletics.

Achievements included:

- Chess: 1st prize at district level; selection for state championship.
- Archery: 3rd place at the National Field Indoor Archery Championship.
- Abacus National Competition: 1st prizes at national level.
- Karate Zonal Tournament: 3rd place by a Class V student.
- Equestrian: Representation at National level.
- Art competitions: Prizes at district level in pencil sketching, drawing, and colouring.

These achievements demonstrate the school’s commitment to nurturing both mind and body.

Infrastructure & Innovations

Continuous improvements in infrastructure supported modern teaching-learning practices. Two Interactive Flat Panel (IFP) Boards were installed to enhance digital learning.

The Thought Room, designed as a creative corner for student ideas, is under development.

RO water purification systems are being installed to ensure safe drinking water for all.

Additionally, a Saraswati Idol was placed in the reception area, symbolizing wisdom and cultural reverence.

Community Engagement & Outreach

Students and teachers participated in social outreach initiatives, including visits to orphanages and old-age homes. They donated essential items and gifts, particularly during Diwali, spreading joy to the less privileged.

The School Benevolent Fund was strengthened, with small contributions encouraged from students to cultivate generosity and empathy.

Safety and Governance

Quarterly safety audits were conducted, and no major issues were reported. Internal checks confirmed compliance with safety standards.

The School Management Committee (SMC) met periodically to deliberate on key academic, infrastructural, and administrative matters.

Important decisions included the commencement of Class XI from 2025–26, fee revisions, and approval of infrastructural projects such as installation of IFP boards and RO systems.

Looking Ahead

The academic year 2024–25 has been marked by resilience, innovation, and achievement. As we prepare to step into next academic year, the school is committed to strengthening academics, co-curricular exposure, and community service.

With continued support from parents, staff, and management, we will nurture well-rounded, responsible, and future-ready citizens.
