

## Annual Report 2025-26

It is with pride and pleasure that I present the Annual Report of Aditya Birla Higher Secondary School for the academic year 2025–26. The past academic year has been a meaningful journey marked by steady progress, disciplined effort, and valuable learning experiences. With the combined commitment of our students, teachers, parents, and management, the school has continued to nurture holistic development and uphold its core values.

The new academic session commenced on June 9, 2025.

Our students demonstrated consistent academic performance in the board examinations. In the Class XII Board Examinations 2024–25, the school achieved a 100% pass result. In the Commerce stream, Zainab Parmar topped the school with 92.5%, followed by Shyama Adhiya, who secured second position with 90.7%, and Diya Vijani, who stood third with 88.7%.

In the Science stream, Venus Sayani emerged as the school topper with 88.9%, followed by Aditya Shah, who secured second position with 87.4%, and Manish Singh, who secured third position with 86.6%.

In the Class X Board Examinations, school once again achieved a 100% pass result. Shreedhari Nathvani topped the school with 95%, followed closely by Vishwa Joshi, who secured 94.67%, while Maulik Vagh secured third position with 94.33%.

Notably, Dhvani Vyas and Rinkal Khoraba achieved a perfect score of 100 out of 100 in Science, reflecting academic excellence and subject mastery.

Holistic development remains a focus at our school. In ABG inter-school competitions, our students brought laurels by securing first position in Senior Group Song (Sur Sangram) and Junior Mime, second position in Junior Moot Court and Sanrakshan, and third position in U 17 Chess.

Demonstrating innovation, teamwork, and scientific aptitude, a team of six students undertook a pioneering STEM project that earned national-level recognition by reaching the final round of the ABG STEM Quest.

Our school team designed EVO DRONE, an innovative project addressing e-vehicle distance anxiety. As part of this achievement, the team received the opportunity to visit ISRO, where they interacted with scientists, and also visited leading industries such as Volvo, TCS, and Sun Mobility in Bengaluru, gaining valuable exposure to real-world technological applications and industry practices.

Our students have also showcased remarkable achievements in co-scholastic activities. In Kala Mahakumbh, they excelled in folk dance, folk song, group song, and Kathak. In the Rural IT Quiz two students qualified for the State Level, demonstrating their technological aptitude. At the Anuvrat Vishwa Bharati Society competitions, our students achieved first positions in Poetry Recitation, Drawing, and the Group Song competition at the state level. In sports, students excelled both individually and as teams, representing the school up to the state level. In the SGFI Games, our students secured a total of 9 gold, 7 silver, and 4 bronze medals. In the Khel Mahakumbh, at the taluka level, students won 3 gold, 5 silver, and 5 bronze medals, while at the district level they achieved 3 gold, 3 silver, and 4 bronze medals. Overall, 37 students qualified for the state level across various sports events.

In the NCC program, 33 Junior Division cadets appeared for the 'A' Certificate Examination. Additionally, 50 students participated in a camp organized by the 7 Gujarat Naval NCC Unit. In SOF Olympiads, 481 students participated, earning 71 gold medals across English, Science, and Mathematics.

At the Science Carnival, our school secured first position in Model Making and Science Quiz at State Level.

As part of infrastructure development, a new academic block and separate washrooms were constructed, classrooms were upgraded with 20 SMART Classes, the computer lab modernized, and an e-library launched to enhance learning.

Recognizing the importance of students' mental and emotional well-being, the MINDS Matter program was integrated across all grades to foster their emotional, psychological, and social growth through mindfulness and self-reflection.

Understanding the importance of social responsibility and environmental stewardship, our students actively participated in community outreach initiatives, engaging in volunteering, awareness campaigns, and sustainability projects. The Sanrakshan team worked at Swaminarayan Gurukul, Tativela village, and Samprat Education Trust, spreading environmental awareness, promoting sustainability, and supporting underprivileged communities. Over 1,000 plastic bottles were transformed into a green garden, earning the ABG Rolling Trophy for two consecutive years. This year, the project of creating mats from waste polythene secured second position in the ABG Sanrakshan Competition. Skill subjects including Tourism, Health & Physical Education, Beauty & Wellness, Coding, AI, Marketing, Financial Management, Horticulture, Handicrafts, Herbal Heritage, Healthcare, and Library Science were introduced for Classes III to XII, providing students with practical skills aligned to their interests and future careers.

Bagless Day and Anandmayi Shanivar offered experiential learning through art, storytelling, clay modelling, yoga, music, and games, fostering creativity, teamwork, emotional well-being, and holistic development.

Keeping parents informed and involved in their children's learning is a key priority for the school. To support this, an ERP system has been implemented, streamlining curriculum updates, assessments, attendance, results, and circulars, and providing a unified platform for parents, teachers, and management to stay connected.

The school collaborated with Extramarks to provide career guidance for students of Classes IX to XII, equipping them to make informed academic and career decisions. The school provided an international platform for students through its participation in the Generation Global program by the Tony Blair Institute. This initiative gave students the opportunity to engage with peers from different countries via video conferences, sharing their perspectives on topics such as Health, Peace, and Fake News & Social Media. The program fostered global awareness, critical thinking, empathy, and confidence among the participants. Staff professional development remains a key priority at Aditya Birla Higher Secondary School.

Throughout the year, our teachers actively participated in a variety of training programmes to support continuous professional growth. This year, the school hosted a Mathematics Workshop for Grades 9–10 teachers from ABG schools, focusing on refining teaching strategies and strengthening problem-solving skills. Additionally, the Annual Principals' Conclave 2025 provided a valuable platform for reflection, collaboration, and learning from global best practices.

The school celebrated key events including International Yoga Day, Teacher's Day, Independence Day, Republic Day, Gandhi Jayanti, Children's Day, and Alumni Meet, promoting values, well-being, and community spirit.

The safety and security of everyone on campus remained a top priority, with regular mock drills for evacuation, fire, and earthquakes, along with awareness sessions on traffic, cyber security, and personal safety. Health and wellness programs addressed oral hygiene, personal care, and adolescent health.

Our clubs and committees, including Literary Club, Science & Eco Club, Art & Craft Club, Heritage and Quiz Club, IT Club, and NCC, encouraged responsibility, leadership, creativity, and civic awareness. Committees such as Grievance Redressal, Anti-Bullying, POCSO, and Disaster efficiently perform their respective duties, ensuring a safe and supportive environment for all.

In conclusion, the academic year 2025-26 has been marked by academic excellence, co-scholastic achievements, holistic development, innovation, community engagement, and celebration of values. I extend my heartfelt gratitude to the management, teachers, parents, and students for their unwavering support and dedication in making this year a remarkable journey of learning and growth.
